DEAR PARENTS & CARERS,

Welcome to 2020! We hope you've had great start to the year. It's great to see students coming back looking refreshed from their Christmas break and getting stuck into the year ahead.

2020 is both an exciting and an important year for Lutterworth College for two main reasons. Firstly, 2020 is the year in which our first cohort of Year 7 students that joined us way back in September 2015 take their GCSEs. In truth, about 50% of the current Year 11 actually started in September 2015 – the rest of the cohort joining us along the way – but it is our first completed cycle of age-range change, and that needs to be celebrated. Of course, as subsequent cohorts of students go through the school the percentage of students that joined us right from Year 7 grows bigger and bigger until we get to our current Year 7 & 8 cohorts who are predominantly, 100% Lutterworth College.

Secondly, our school is 140 years old this year and it is an poignant marker in time (1880-2020) to an educational setting to recognise the fact that the community of Lutterworth and the surrounding area have been choosing this school to educate their children for such a significant length of time. There are many changes afoot in the educational landscape – and whatever the school has been – Lutterworth Grammar School, Lutterworth Community College, Lutterworth College – and whatever it will be in the future, especially with the challenges and opportunities that exist in collaborations with other schools and Trusts, Lutterworth College has an undeniably rich legacy and history that cannot be negated. It is a history made by the young people that attend the school and go onto play positive roles within society.

At the start of this term we welcome two new members of staff to our teaching community. Adam Hutchinson joins as part of the senior leadership team and whose primary responsibility will be to lead the Maths Department (as well as Business & Computing). Adam joins us with a wealth of experience acquired in local schools and he will be initially focusing on supporting and getting the best results for those students taking GCSE Maths in this summer's examinations.
