YEAR 11 MASTERCLASSES

After May half term we will be switching to a revision timetable with masterclasses offered to Year 11 students when they are not in external exams.

Where not all students are in an exam, lessons timetabled for that period will run as normal as 'masterclasses' focusing on revision and preparation for students upcoming exams in that subject. Students should attend these sessions when not in an exam. Early next term we will be writing to parents and students to share the timetable with you and provide further details about masterclass and pre-exam booster session arrangements.

Also pre-exam booster sessions will run AM and PM prior to the start of all exams. AM boosters will take place from 8.25 – 8.45am and PM boosters will take place from 12.40 – 1.00pm. We are planning to provide breakfast for students attending the AM boosters (fruit, fruit juice and breakfast biscuits/pastries). For English, Maths and Science exams these boosters will take place in the Q Zone. For all options subjects they will take place in classrooms.

10 REVISION TIPS

Download practise papers from the examination board – Practise, practise, practise! – use mark schemes to selfassess.

Download the specification for your examination – RAG all the content – focus on the material you don't know clearly yet.

Revise in chunks of 20-40 minutes – take regular breaks.

Eat a healthy diet, drink lots of water and sleep well.

Place yourself under some self-imposed restrictions for 'technology'. None is best but if you can't live without it – no more than an hour a day.

Picture yourself on examinations day picking up your results – will you feel you've done yourself justice?
