DEAR PARENTS & CARERS,

Welcome to the school's weekly newsletter.

Another week – another show! This week the cast have been showcasing parts of their performance in assemblies and we are really looking forward to their full performance.

Next week, the 2nd set of Pre Public Examinations start for Year 11 & Year 13 in what is the critical run-up to the summer exam series. Once complete, the school encourages all Year 11 & 13 students to complete Easter 100 – 100 hours of planned revision over the Easter holidays. This equates to approximately 25% of each day as a minimum; this may sound excessive to some but it is what students in other centres are being asked to do (and more) as an absolute minimum. Friday night wraps up a busy week with the Friend of Lutterworth College Quiz Night – unfortunately this one is all sold out now but we're positive another fundraiser will not be far away!

Finally, before we depart for Easter a reminder that Enrichment day is on the last day of term. The trip lists are displayed on the main hall windows. If students do not have a place, they will be in school and taking part in departmental activities in school. If they do not wish to keep their place on a trip, then parents need to follow the instruction in the allocation email to notify the school.
