These trips have been self-funded and she has approached numerous companies for donations of items to take with her. On one occasion, Olivia took football kit for a girls team, donated by LCFC. Olivia is currently campaigning to end sexism in girls football, and has gained support from the Lionesses and other sports stars. She is aiming to produce a video to be shown in primary schools to encourage girls to play football and for this to be the accepted norm. She recently addressed a UEFA conference in Budapest and was also invited to attend the women's England v Japan game in Nice.

LUTTERWORTH COLLEGE SHOW CHOIR CHAMPIONS OF LEICESTERSHIRE!!!

The Lutterworth College Show Choir were crowned the Leicestershire School Choir of the Year for 2019 at The Haymarket Theatre on Tuesday 2nd July, beating off stiff competition from Brockington College, King Edward VII College and last years winners Gartree High School.

The standard of singing and performance was amazing from all the Choirs, and the packed out audience relished every note and every move (yes, there was some choreo!) from the 9 Primary and Secondary Schools who had progressed into the Grand Final. Our Show Choir performed a breath-taking set, starting with the Acapella/Barbershop arrangement of 'Come Fly With Me' and concluding with Mr Lubkowski's arranegement of 'A Million Dreams' from The Greatest Showman, featuring up to 6 part harmonies at times! The feedback from the judges (David Lawrence and Sophie Pascall) at the end of the evening before the results were announced was amazing, praising the advanced harmonic and melodic singing in 'Come Fly With Me', and appreciating the heartfelt and passionate performance of 'A Million Dreams' – the students were beaming to hear such praise from our esteemed judging panel!

The students were then thrilled to be announced as both the Secondary School winners and the overall Leicestershire Schools Choir of the Year Champions, with Poppy James (Year 8) and Abe Armitage (Year 10) accepting the trophy on behalf of all of us.

It's been an amazing year with Show Choir – they have turned up on Wednesday lunchtimes week in week out since the very first week of the year back in September, and they have made amazing progress and achieved so much because of that dedication and regular commitment. This is a great reward for all their hard work, and we look forward to seeing what they do next year!
