As a Church of England school, Lutterworth College was inspected under Section 48 of the Education Act 2005 on the 16th & 17th May 2019. Our school's last SIAMS inspection was in 2013.

If you want to read the full report it is on the College website. The two judgements given were:

Overall Judgement: Good

Collective worship judgement: Good

As with the OFSTED inspection in late 2017 the grades given to Lutterworth College match the reflective judgements of the school's leadership prior to the inspection.

We are rightfully very proud and pleased with the content of the report. As with the recent OFSTED report it gives the school a platform on which to build our journey to outstanding & excellence.

The Key Findings of the report are:

- The school has a powerful Christian vision which has considerable impact on the lives of all pupils, and is particularly evident in the pastoral care system
- The school has a strong and effective senior leadership team with a clear understanding of the vision and a development programme to further embed it in the life of the school
- Religious Education is very effective, and this is clearly evident in the ability of pupils to speak readily and confidently about religious and spiritual matters
- Collective worship is well planned to communicate the vision. Pupils engage readily and understand the relevance to their lives

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all who contributed towards this report not least the parents that attended as part of the inspection process.

Earlier this week, six of our year 12 students attended a workshop at Robert Smyth Academy, delivered by school liaisons from both Oxford and Cambridge. This was a great opportunity to learn more about the application process, most significantly how the students will go about evidencing their involvement in 'super curricular' activities linking directly to their Oxbridge course. The students found this to be a valuable experience and will be attending a follow up session in October where they will learn more about how to effectively prepare for the latter stages of the application process, focusing on both admissions tests and interviews.

This will be an excellent opportunity for our prospective veterinarians to gain insight into the application process and the profession itself. HOMEWORK CLUB

DIFFICULTY PERSUADING YOUR CHILD TO COMPLETE HOMEWORK WHEN THEY'D RATHER BE DOING SOMETHING DIFFERENT INSTEAD?

Students can often prefer to keep their school life and home life separate and this is possible in the younger years but can become more challenging as students progress through the school years.

We offer the opportunity for students to remain in the school library from 3.15pm until 4.30pm Monday to Thursday each week to complete homework before they return home.

- •Ensure that they are focussed on homework and learning
- •If all homework has been completed, use the time to read a book quietly, this is proven to enhance knowledge and supports the ability to produce interesting writing and improves concentration
- •Quietly practice or extend learning by using educational packages such as Mymaths or Seneca Learning
- •Work in a quiet and sensible manner
- •Show respect in maintaining a quiet environment for other students
